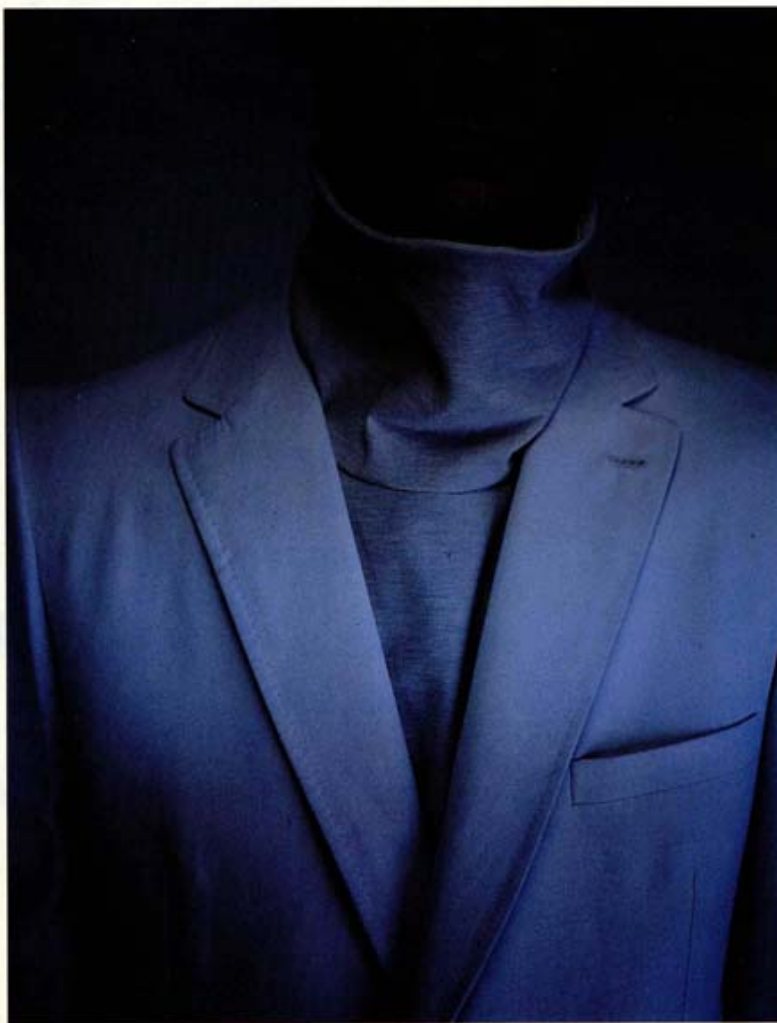


## Kenzo
